

## How quickly are rats adopted?

Many factors affect how long it may take for rats to get adopted. The average foster time is typically anywhere from one to six months.

We ask for a minimum twelve-month commitment.

## How much will it cost to foster?

Cages and accessories may be borrowed or purchased.

We ask fosters to purchase fresh foods, plus the dry mix and litter after the initial supply.

Any Rat Rescue pays 100% of medical costs.

## Can I choose the rats I foster?

Surrenders are beyond our control, however we actively seek the best matches between foster families and rats.



# Why do rats need fostering?

Pet rats are often overlooked or misunderstood. They are intelligent, social creatures that make wonderful companions. Unfortunately, many find themselves in need of rescue.

The number of rats we can help solely depends on the number of foster homes.



# What kind of space do I need?

Generally, the larger the cage, the better! The cage should be at least 2ft x 3ft and two levels.

Your foster rats will also need a safe place where they can spend free range time outside their cage.



# What do I do as a foster?

-  Interact with your fosters daily.
-  Maintain a clean cage.
-  Keep vet appointments (ARR covers all medical expenses.)
-  Meet with potential adopters.

# Is my family at risk?

Pet rats don't carry rabies or the plague. Of all small critters, they are the least likely to bite.

# What if there's a problem?

All fosters are provided care information and an Any Rat Rescue team member to contact in case of emergency. Our goal is to ensure you have the most positive experience possible.
